Temporary Overnight Lane Closures on New Jersey Avenue NW September 26-27

(Washington, DC) - The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) will implement temporary lane closures on New Jersey Avenue NW between New York Avenue NW and N Street NW, and 3rd Street NW between New Jersey Avenue NW and New York Avenue NW. Construction activity will begin at 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, September 26, 2019 and conclude at 5:00 a.m. on September 27, 2019.

The work is required to perform waterline connection and installation activities as a part of the Safety Improvements on New Jersey Avenue NW Project.

Traffic controls will be in place to guide all users of the roadway through the work zone safely. Motorists should expect delays due to the lane closures and are advised to stay alert and observe signage and road work crews while traveling in this area.

Curbside parking may also be restricted while work is underway. Emergency No Parking signs will be posted a minimum of 72 hours before the start of construction. Sidewalk detours will also be in place while sidewalk repair is in progress. Signage and protective barriers will be used to maintain public safety.
